❖ Explains and represents how we are invited to join in the Christian family through Baptism
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents the elements of Baptism such as water, oil, candle, white garment</li> <li>• Explains and represents the rituals of the gathering at Sunday Liturgy</li> <li>• Plans and presents a gathering celebration</li> </ul>

❖ Explains the meaning of sacred space

### **We Celebrate the Word**

#### **❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the Bible and Jesus as God’s Word**

- Explains how the Bible and Jesus are God’s way of speaking to people
- Plans and presents a celebration of the word

### **We Savor the Word**

#### **❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the Bible and Jesus as God’s Word**

- Explains and represents their impression of the “Come and See” story
- Explains how the Sunday assembly celebrates the Word

### **We Respond to the Word**

#### **❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the Bible and Jesus as God’s Word**

- Recalls and retells their favorite caring stories about Jesus
- Explains and represents the miracle stories from Matthew 11:2-5 and Luke 5:1-11

## **Unit Four – Let’s Treasure God’s Presence**

### **In Advent We Listen**

#### **❖ Explains and represents Advent as preparation for the Christmas season**

- Explains and represents the importance and meaning of signs and symbols of Advent
- Retells the story of the Annunciation

### **In Advent We Treasure**

#### **❖ Explains and represents the role of key figures of Advent**

- Shares stories of visiting and links it to the Visitation story
- Recalls Mary’s response
- Retells the story of the Visitation through role play and art

### **In Advent We Respond**

#### **❖ Explains and represents Advent as preparation for the Christmas season**

- Explains and represents the story of John the Baptist
- Plans and presents an Advent celebration

## **Unit Five – Let’s Treasure God’s Gift**

### **Jesus Is God’s Gift to Us**

#### **❖ Explains and represents the Christmas and Epiphany Stories**

- Retells and represents the Christmas story, including the coming of the Magi
- Explains the importance and meaning of the signs and symbols of Christmas
- Plans and presents a celebration recognizing Jesus as gift from God

### **We Treasure the Gift of God’s Story**

#### **❖ Demonstrates how we can care for God’s gifts**

- Explains and represents the fruits of God’s creation
- Explains how they are called to love and care for all creation
- Plans and presents a celebration of the Creed in song and gesture

<b>With Jesus We Pray Together</b>
❖ Explains and represents the ritual elements of the Liturgy of the Word
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recalls scripture stories of caring and call to mind people they know who need care</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents through art and role playing how they can care for others</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Creates spontaneous prayer for their families, communities, parishes, and world</li> </ul>

<b>Unit Six – Let’s Take</b>
<b>We Savour the Gifts From the Earth</b>
❖ Explains and represents how God has gifted us with the earth

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Represents ways they can care for creation</li> </ul>

<b>We Celebrate the Work of Human Hands</b>
❖ Explains and represents the key elements of the Eucharist

<b>We Prepare the Table of the Eucharist</b>
❖ Explains the special meaning of the gift of the Eucharist
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents the connection between the family table and the table of the Eucharist</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents the relationship between “table” and “altar”</li> </ul>

<b>Unit Seven – Let’s Bless</b>
<b>We Lift Up Our Hearts to the Lord</b>
❖ Explains and represents the prayers and rituals associated with the Liturgy of the Eucharist
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Expresses thanks to God through word, gesture, song, and art</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains how through word, gesture, and song we give glory to God</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Creates prayers of praise and blessing to thank God for all we have been given</li> </ul>
<b>Do This In Memory Of Me</b>
❖ Explains and represents Lent as a memorial of the Death and Resurrection
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents the connection between the Last Supper and the Eucharist</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents the importance of meal in Jesus’ life – remembering the Last Supper</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains and represents how Christians gather to celebrate the Eucharist</li> </ul>
<b>May the Holy Spirit Come Upon These Gifts</b>
❖ Explains and represents the prayers and rituals associated with the Liturgy of the Eucharist
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains the role and action of the Holy Spirit</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explains that prayer is a way to talk to God</li> </ul>

## **Unit Eight – Let’s Break**

### **Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread**

❖ Demonstrates how reconciliation and forgiveness lead us to right relationship with God and with others

- Explains the “Our Father” as a request for daily bread and reconciliation with others
- Demonstrates signs of forgiveness in gesture, word, action
- Recites the Lord’s Prayer using gestures
- Explains and represents what it means to share peace with one another

### **Bread Broken For You, and Cup Poured Out For You**

❖ Explains and represents the Easter story

- Explains and represents the Passion story through art, mime
- Explains the Holy Week rituals
- Explains the sharing of the bread and wine at Eucharist as a sign of unity
- Plans and presents Holy Week celebrations

### **You Are Invited to the Table of the Eucharist**

❖ Explains and represents the Easter story

- Explains what it means to serve and help others
- Demonstrates ways we are called to serve and help others; like Jesus in the washing of the feet

## **Unit Nine – Let’s Eat and Drink**

### **! He is Risen!**

❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the Church’s liturgical seasons and symbols

- Explains how the changes in color in the Church and on the prayer table reflect Easter joy
- Represents Easter joy in song, gesture, and art
- Prepares for and shares an Alleluia party

### **Come, Take and Eat**

❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the Church’s liturgical seasons and symbols

- Explains and represents the story of Jesus’ breakfast on the shore
- Explains how we remember Jesus on Sunday in the Eucharist
- Plans and shares a breakfast together

### **Jesus Is Our Food and Drink**

❖ Demonstrates an understanding of the gift of the Eucharist

- Explains and represents stories of how Jesus shares food
- Explains and represents the meaning of sharing
- Explains Jesus as the bread of life
- Plans and carries out an outreach activity, following Jesus’ example of caring for others

## **Unit Ten – Let’s Go Forth**

### **With God’s Blessings We Go Forth**

#### **❖ Demonstrates an understanding of being blessed and sent forth by God**

- Demonstrates through art, drama, story ways to serve one another
- Explains what it means to be “blessed”
- Explains and represents God’s gift of peace

### **We Meet the Lord Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread**

#### **❖ Explains and represents the four movements of the Eucharistic Liturgy**

- Explains and represents the Emmaus story
- Explains and represents the connection between the Emmaus story and the Sunday Eucharist
- Explains how the story of Cleopas and his companion parallel the dismissal rite of the Eucharist

### **Let’s Celebrate**

#### **❖ Explains and represents the four movements of the Eucharistic Liturgy**

- Explains the meaning of “sending forth” – to love and serve
- Explains and demonstrates what it means to share peace with one another
- Plans and presents a celebration for the end of the year
